 - A. Why did Orwell choose animals to represent people in his allegory?
 - B. Where do you see biblical truths in the story?
4. Fill in the Chapter Summaries sections on “The Russian Revolution and *Animal Farm* Historical Events and Chapter Summaries.”
5. Vocabulary
 - Capitulate—to surrender or give in after a struggle
 - Complicity—shared responsibility
 - Ignominious—shameful and embarrassing
 - Taciturn—reserved, quiet
 - Tractable—easy to persuade or influence
